Participants will learn from experts and leaders in the infant and early childhood mental health field through a combination of live presentations, asynchronous learning, and networking opportunities. The program emphasizes the importance of diversity and equity, the impact of historical trauma on non-dominant groups, and highlights the importance of cultural humility when working with young children and families.

#### The Certificate in Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health



- Gain clinical knowledge and experience working with parents and young children
- Synthesize cutting-edge readings and materials in the infant mental health field
- Discussion and networking with thought leaders and peers from around the country

#### The Certificate in Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (IECMHC)



- Train in the specialized role of consulting in early childhood settings
- Engage with national experts and faculty who have created, implemented, and guided national IECMHC programs
- Develop an expert network to promote and support your professional development

#### The Certificate in Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health Family Leadership



- Prepares caregivers of young children as front-line peer support and community health workers
- Gain practical experience to support other caregivers and work equitably in communities
- Effectively promote and support early childhood mental health and family resiliency
